This Cause being docketed by Consent of parties and assent of the Court came on this day to be heard on the bill answers exhibits and arguments of counsel Whereupon and upon due consideration thereof had the Court are of opinion that William Blunt the younger altho he dies without lawful issue had at the time of his death an absolute fee simple estate in the lands and water brist Mill devised to him in his Father William Blunt the Elder's last will and Testament, and that the devise over to John Norfleet Blunt in case William should die without issue was too remote to take effect it being after an indefinite future if issue They therefore order sequeze and decree that Allen Jones, Benjamin W. Whiston, James Lee James M. Camp and Remond Turner Jr. or any two of them with the County Surveyor do divide the tract of Land of which William Blunt the younger dies seized into six equal parts having regard as well to quality as quantity by proper meters and bounds and that they assign and sell one Sixth part to James Kello and Mary W. his wife in right of his said wife Mary one Sixth part to Francis Risley and Louisa R. his wife in right of his said wife Louisa R. one Sixth part to Ann L. Wilkinson, one Sixth part to Eliza W. Blunt, one Sixth part to Martha P. Blunt and the remaining Sixth part to the said John Norfleet Blunt, they further decree that the water brist Mill mentioned in the Complainants bill and devised in the will of William Blunt the Elder to the said William Blunt the younger he sold on a credit of twelve months by the aforesaid commissioners or any two of them and that they take six bonds of equal amount from the purchaser or purchasers with approve Security and assign the same to the Complainants and the defendant and make a deed of conveyance in fee simple for the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof and it is further decreed and ordered that the said defendant John Norfleet Blunt do account with the aforesaid commissioners for the rents and profits of the aforesaid tract of land and Mill from the first day of January 1814 and that they make a report to this Court of their acting and doing therein in order to a final decree

Ordered that Arthur Hollman, John Harvey and Silas Sumnerell or any two of them do examine Hays and Little an account of the administration on the estate of William Hollman deceased and make a report thereof to the Court

Drewy Waller is by the Court appointed Guardian to Henry Bittle, Drewy Bittle, Fanny Bittle and Eliza Bittle orphans of Robert Bittle deceased who together with Henry J. P. Westbrook and Cordal Brantley his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars with conditions according to law
