On the motion of Robert Rochelle who makes with us together with Lucy Rochelle his wife, Robert Rochelle and John Rochelle his Sonnes intend unto us acknowledge and bind the penalty of Twenty Thousand dollars Conscience to the sum aforesaid for thinking letter of administration Robines now on the estate of Jonathan Lewis deceased with his wife Ruth for want and recd in the Court, amongst our due forms.

The persons appointed at November last, to make a survey of the land and have whereof Lewis Blane deceased his Agent and his trustee donee of the land wherof Lewis Blane deceased his Agent.
