

Maple Landing in the Anglica Branch thence along that branch to Perimeter Trees
a corner in the same branch, thence along the dividing line of lots No 2 and 3 to
a post a new corner under no 2 to the line of lot 1 and 2 to the first station
and from thence along the dividing line of lots No 1 and 2 to the first station
being lot No 2 which lot was known by Joshua's Island containing 22 Acres
being the house lot which is his full proportionable part of the lands shown
in the same land and deed. Dimensions of the third lot No 3 Beginning at
a Perimeter Tree Landing in the Anglica Branch, running thence S 51. W 79.
pole to a white oak side of a red corner of William's Island thence S 46. W 20
pole thence S 65. W 16 pole to a new corner under no 2 small branch between
lots No 2 and 3 thence along that dividing line to a Post a new corner in the
corner of lot No 2 and 3 thence along the dividing line of lots No 2 and 3
to the first station, being lot No 3 containing 15 Acres which lot was known
by Joseph's Island, being his full proportionable part of the 100 Acres which
James Island and Joseph's all of which part of land we have divided agreeable
to quality and quantity as will fully appear by the number of acres given in
each lot we have also under the said deed further provided that the said
said lot as part to the complainant Joseph's Island and the two defendants
Joshua's Island and James Island all the negroes belonging to the estate of

Male Valued at 400 dollars, Males 300 dollars also 250 dollars and one 200 dollars
making in all 1350 dollars which lot of negroes was known by James Island
which is his full proportion of all the negroes of his deceased Father after
receiving from Joseph's Island lot No 2, 25 dollars which two sums added
together makes 1375 dollars his full proportionable part of the negroes of
his deceased Father. Lot No 3 of the negroes is now valued at 400 dollars
Males 300 dollars, Males 200 dollars, Males 100 dollars making in all 1300 dollars
which lot was known by Joseph's Island being his full proportion of the negroes
of his deceased Father after paying to James Island lot No 1 of the negroes the
sum of 25 dollars and to Joshua's Island lot No 2 the sum of 25 dollars
which proportion James being deducted from 1300 leaves 1275 dollars his full
proportionable part of all the negroes of his deceased Father —
Lot No 3 of the negroes is now valued at 400 dollars Fanny No 3 Nancy 300 Anthony
250 Mary 250 dollars making in all 1250 dollars being his full proportionable
part of all the negroes of James Island deceased after receiving from Joseph's
Island lot No 2 the sum of 25 dollars which sum added together makes
1275 dollars makes his full proportion of all the negroes of his deceased Father
Also agreeable to a further order of the County Court of Southampton being
the same date as within mentioned we had proceeded with the sale of
the sum of Southampton County to Henry and divided all the land
of Elizabeth Island equally between the complainant and
defendants in manner and form following to wit Beginning at a Maple
a corner Landing in the Anglica Branch, running thence N. 62. W 14 pole
to a Perimeter Tree, thence N. 44. W 40 pole, thence N. 6. W 30 pole to a
a Post corner of Henry Barrow's Estate, thence N. 69. W 24 pole thence
N. 48. W 40 pole thence S. 52. W 70 pole thence S. 76. W 56 pole to a corner
