The cause was this day docketed by consent of the parties and the court of the bar  
and was heard before the bar, and the answer of the defendants are now agreed by counsel  
whereupon the court doth agree over and above the sum of one thousand dollars, to the sum  
and Lawrence look or any share of them as payment whether the said of land containing  
acres, heretofore attested to Ulysses Whitehead, lies in his life time when he died  
in the land of which his second husband William Whitehead died, subject to the amount  
of four hundred dollars in value the sum of five hundred dollars are set off shall be found  
to exceed five hundred dollars. That they three, attested with the sum of the amount were the  
said parcel of Land into five equal parts and also one of the said parts to the complainant  
Jacob Darden another of the said parts to the defendant Ulysses Whitehead, Zephry Whitehead  
and Content Whitehead, another of the said parts to the defendant Nathan L. Whitehead and  
the remaining three parts to the defendant Joseph B. Whitehead. But if it shall be found that  
the said Parcel of Land doth not exceed in value the sum of five hundred dollars the said  
complainants are to sell the same at public auction on a day of twelve months, giving at  
least ten weeks previous public notice of the time and place of sale and to execute a bill  
of exchange and sale therefor without moratorium to the purchaser from whom they are to be  
recovered four bonds with sufficient security, one for one third part of the purchase money  
payable to Jacob Darden, one for one other fifth part thereof payable to the said Ulysses Whitehead  
knowing of the aforesaid children of Richard Whitehead deceased and for one other fifth part  
thereof payable to the said Nathan L. Whitehead and one for three fifths part thereof payable to  
the said Joseph B. Whitehead to each of whom the said bonds are to be delivered provided however  
and it is hereby required that the said complainants demand of the purchasers the sum of  
fifteen dollars and back for the purpose of satisfying the debt of the last which the court  
will hereafter proportion among the parties. It is further agreed sums are taxed by the  
court that the said complainants or any share of them as direct the following taxes next  
with his child first, Ben, Christian Fanny, Roger, Sam, also and by which one  
of the sum of the said Richard Whitehead, deceased on the estate of his deceased husband  
and by equal parts are also one of the said parts to the complainant Jacob Darden two  
thirds of the said parts to the aforesaid children of the said Richard Whitehead deceased to the  
sums to their executors Zephry D. B. etc, one third of the said part to the defendant Nathan L.  
Whitehead, one third of the said part to the defendant Joseph B. Whitehead and the  
remaining equal tenth part to the defendant Joseph B. Whitehead. In case of a division  
of the aforesaid parcel of land, the court will here after if necessary make an order  
for the subdivision or sale of that part attested to the aforesaid children of Richard  
Whitehead deceased, for the purpose of a division or distribution among them to whom with  
regard to the taxes which may be attested to them. It is lastly ordered that the said  
complainants make a report of their actions and doings in this behalf to the court  
as often as to a final decree.
