On the motion of John Fairbanks who made oath and together with William Phillips and John  
Nochelle his kinsmen entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of eight hundred  
dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of  
administration on the estate of Alice May deceased in due form

On the motion of Miles M. Denny who made oath and together with John Fairbanks and  
William Phillips his kinsmen entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two  
thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining  
letters of administration on the estate of Rebecca M. Denny deceased in due form

George W. Thomas of this County did bring into the County of a small estate in which no
