On the motion of Polly Bristo who came with and together with Samuel Bassett and Willis Bassett her Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted her for obtaining Letters of Administration on the Estate of William Bristo deceased and as follows

James Carr is by the Court appointed ^{Guardian} to Henry Glor ophian of John Glor deceased Whereupon the said James together with Abingdon Jones and Henry Gardner his Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One Thousand dollars with condition according to Law —

Athene a bond is by the Court appointed Guardian to John Glor ophian of John Glor deceased Whereupon the said Athene together with Abingdon Jones and Henry Gardner his Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two hundred and fifty dollars with condition according to Law —
