this at Court held for the County of Southampton the 12th day of March 1806 description
being taken, therefore it is decreed and ordered that the said before be held from
stable and business between the parties and that the said be proportionally borne between
them

his signature bond from him fully heard by Court. The Court after hearing all the
circumstances of the case, are of opinion, that administration be granted to said Griffin
upon his giving bond and security. From which opinion of the Court the said
Dawson proges in appeal to the Court of Appeals Court is he selected for this County which
is granted him on his giving bond and security in the sum of fifty dollars which is
accordingly done
