Our Inventory and apperannce of the estate of Alvin Jones deceased was this day returned
and ready to be recorded -

The present ^{month} of November bound 1799 to make a division in the same in this County, Whereof
William & Baker and Sons, the day made their report in the month and year
following to this Court to the amount above, in the summing, in Consequence
of the late Lee one of the Conspicuous names in said case, as on or about the
5th day of January 1806 Attested appears and set a part to the defendant in the case
above mentioned her son in the name of William & Baker and Sons in
the County of Southampton as follows Vizt 200 Acres heretofore as pointed out in a plot
of the land called the late Town, that taken by John Barnard a Richard Blawatt
the County Surveyor which said plot accompanie this report are respectively distributed
as part of the same, now Conspicuous, there present in further sume to be measured
to divide the remainder of the said land into three parts, with a view to a Subdivision
of each for the purpose of apportioning to the several claimants as directed by the
law, two of these three parts are allotted to Henry Briggs, and Martha Baker,
one to the children of Richd Baker deceased, and the other to the children of Blake
Baker deceased Vizt to Henry Briggs and Martha Baker the first on the above
mentioned Plot number 250 Acre on their paying to Blake Baker children of 1/2
to the children of Richard Baker deceased No 250 the second on the same, Plot number
250 Acres on their paying to the children of Blake Baker 1/2 & 1/4 to the children
of Blake Blake, the last Contained in the plot, called the Plot of the person deceased
which also accompanie this report which is 235 1/2 Acres and the sum of £100 to be
paid them by Henry Briggs and Martha Baker out of £50, to be paid them by the children
of Richard Baker as above, now Conspicuous by leave to State, that they fully
intended, to have fully signed the deed, but that having proceeded as far in the
business as before stated the parties interested, failed to attend from some cause
unknown to the undersigned, as consequence of which they could not with any
sort of convenience furnish the business, and as it has law ever since Wherefore
we pray to be discharged from such, on hands the 1st day of October 1816.

Jacob Dawson, Joseph Newson, which was agreed to be two hours for signature
one at a court held for the County of Southampton the 19th day of March 1806 rescript
being taken Whereupon it is agreed and sworn that the business aforesaid be held between

On the motion of Micajah Griffin for administration on the estate of Jacob Higginbotham
deceased which motion was offere by Samuel Bassett Esquire for the County of Southampton
an injunction bond being fully heard by Council. The Court after hearing all the
circumstances of the case, are of opinion, that administration be granted to said Griffin
upon his giving bond and security. From which opinion of the Court, the bond
was drawn and an appeal to the Court Superior Court to be held for this County which
is granted here on his giving bond and security on the sum of fifty dollars which is
accordingly done
