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An Indenture of bargain and Sale between William Johnson and Patsy his wife of the County of Oglethorpe in the State of Georgia of the one part and Benjamin Davis of the County of the other part with a lawful witness entered of Benjamin Davis a single estate of the said County of Oglethorpe. Testifying the acknowledgment of the said Johnson and the acknowledgment and giving transmission of the said Patsy. It is to be published of Davis (the Clerk of the said County of Oglethorpe) under his hand and Seal of his office testifying that this above mentioned conveyance, was committed to records in the said County, and that Benjamin Johnson was an acting magistrate of that County, and also with a certificate of Henry Graham on the 11th of the said County of Oglethorpe, testifying that Davis (the Clerk of the said County of Oglethorpe) of the above family, was this day found in Court for record, and thereupon was ordered to be recorded.

James Lee who was summoned to this Court to qualify as an owner of the part of the County in the upper part of Saint Luke Parish, this day appeared, and upon his motion not to qualify, and for sufficient reason offered to the Court. His Honor did he disagree, and it is also noted that Benjamin Blount (of Benjamin) he summoned to the next Court to qualify as such in the name of the said James Lee.

On the motion of Thomas Rutter who made oath, and together with Thomas Jones and John Summerville his Trustees entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted the said Thomas Rutter for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of John Summerville deceased, with his small vestiges of the record in the Court, (and also in due form).

Richmond Dillard is appointed Surveyor of the road from South Quay Bridge to the fork of the road near Deep River, and from the fork of the road near Deep River to the County line in the name of Arthur Low, who hath rendered. It is ordered that the male labouring Fiddlers who usually make diversion do attend and assist the said Surveyor in repairing the said road where required.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County, with whom the estate of Rev. Phillips deceased hath been committed, pay to John Hargreaves the sum of Thirty Dollars with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of the five per centum per annum from the first day of January 1868 till paid (Also Fifty two cents both, and account with the Court).

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County, with whom the estate of Willie Williamson deceased hath been committed, pay to Rachel Williams the sum of Twenty Five dollars and Fifty Cents both, and account with the Court.

An Indenture of bargain and Sale between Jacob Dawson of the one part and John Parker of the other part, was acknowledged in open Court by the said Jacob Dawson and ordered to be recorded.
