Williams, Value at and pays Lett No 7 — \$1.62 and Lett No 6 the sum of \$51.42 and Lett No 5 the sum of \$51.42. Lett No 5 drawn by Samuel Francis negro Mose, receive from Lett No 2 — \$18.29 and from Lett No 4 \$51.42 Lett No 6 drawn by Martha Francis, receive and John receive from Lett No 3 \$18.29 and from Lett No 4 \$51.42. Lett No 7 drawn by Nathaniel Francis negro Thomas Francis and Lett receive from Lett No 2 — \$18.29 and from Lett No 4 the sum of \$51.42 being their proportional part of the negroes service now due within mentioned times after Paying and receiving as above recited.

From these our hands this 20th day of May 1816, Wm Francis, Edmund Turner & August Knapp. Whereas said decree and order that the foregoing survey be held firm State and binding between the Parties and that the Co. be proportionally bound between them

The Commissioners appointed by a former decree of this Court to make a division of the lands whereof Captain Samuel Remond's heirs Leges are possessed this day made their report in the more and figures following to wit: "Agreeable to an order of the County Court of Southampton to be made bearing date November Court 1815 we the undersigned have proceeded to Run out Survey and divide the lands in the Lapse's legacy whereof Captain Samuel Remond's heirs Leges, otherwise with the County Surveyors as by the order we were required in manner and form following (to wit) Beginning at an ash on the side of the cliffport a corner of Elizabeth Remond's and Lett No 1 in the Lapse's legacy measured thence S. 7. 2 1/2 Poles to a red oak a corner of Elizabeth Remond's and Leges Schussabine, thence S. 34. 10 20 Poles to a pine a new corner made in Lett No 192 in the out bounds, thence N. 57. 10 1/2 Poles to a small ash a new corner made in Lett No 192 starting on the line of the Cliffport thence N. 45. 4 20 Poles to the first Station, containing 15 Acres being Lett No 1 in the Lapse's legacy which Lett was drawn by Elizabeth Remond's being his Proportional Part of the said lands. — Thence Beginning at an ash on the line of the Cliffport a new corner made in Lett No 192 and running S. 57. 2 1/2 Poles to a pine a new corner made in Lett No 192, thence S. 34. 10 20 Poles to a lightwood a new corner made in Lett No 295, thence N. 57. 10 1/2 Poles to white oak new corner made on the Cliffport opposite a corner in Lett No 2 75, thence N. 45. 4 20 Poles to the first Station, containing 16 Acres being Lett No 2 which Lett was drawn by Henry Knapp and others being their full Proportional part in the Lands of the said legacy. — Thence Beginning at a white oak a new corner made in Lett No 2 75 on the main pond side
