

The Last will and Testament of William Johnson deceased, was proved by the oath of Benjamin Wilson one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that William Bailey, John Holmes, John Lammewell and John Layton or any three of them, do examine the said will, the account of the executor on the estate of John Brattle deceased and make a report thereof as before.

Ordered that the Justices of this County be summoned to the next Court for the purpose of saying and appraising the bounty land.

The Persons appointed by a former order of this Court, Procepio Masters and Recinct A.D. This day made their report in the words and figures following to wit: "Southampton County, Pursuant to the annexed order made & presented to procepio at the Land in the Recinct A.D. Except a line between Captain Elliott and Benjamin Turner which is disputed, also one other line between between Doctor Musgrave and Richard Harrison. In the presence of Benjamin Turner, Thomas Elliott, Doctor Musgrave, Richard Harrison & Richard Harrison & Thomas Harrison & the said Harrison & Nathan Turner & Doctor Kelt, John Greenmont and Presley Britt, was made employed by us in performing the duty, Given under our hands this 7th of March 1816. John Williams Benjamin Harrison." Which was ordered to be recorded.

The Account of the estate of Samuel Rowlett was this day returned and ordered to be recorded.

The Account of the estate of Elizabeth Soyner deceased was this day returned and ordered to be recorded.

The Persons appointed Procepio Masters for Recinct A.D. by a former order of this Court. This day made their report in the words and figures following to wit: "In obedience to an order of the most honorable Court of Southampton County dated August Court 1815, we have quietly procured all the lands lying between Leese, Black Water and Black Water and in seven days, except the line between Simon Boykin and Daniel Boykin, and were there before by the said Simon Boykin. Given under our hands this 15th day of May 1816. Samuel S. Boykin, David S. Boykin." Which was ordered to be recorded.

The Persons appointed by a former order of this Court, to view, ^{as before} the premises and encumbrances, that will result as well to the Public as to individuals in opening a road. This day made their report in the words and figures following to wit: "Apparable to an order of the County Court of Southampton to us in the said County dated 11th of May 1816. We the undersigned have viewed the road turned by John Layton as by the order we were required and find the same to be in good repair, as we think the same correct. Given under our hands and seal this 11th day of May 1816. James Jones, William Soyner." Which was ordered to be recorded.
