on the estate of John Briscoe deceased and make a report thereof to the Court —

Ordered that the Surveyors of this County be Summoned to the next Court for  
the purpose of laying and defining the boundary line —

The Persons appointed by a former oyer of this Court, Proceffion masters in  
Precinct No. 5. This day made their report in the words and figures following to wit —  
In Southampton County. Pursuant to the aforesaid order we have proceeded to  
proceffion all the Lands in the Precinct No. 5 except a line between certain  
Planters and Benjamin Johnson which is disputed, also one other line to paticular  
between Doctor Mariner and Richard Harrison. In the presence of Benjamin  
Turner, Thomas Clifton, Doctor Mariner, Richard Harrison & Richard Harrison Jr.  
Thomas Harrison Jr. the witness to whom it was shown to, Nathan Turner & Doctor Hite, John  
Inman and Peter Briscoe, we were employed six days in performing the  
duty. Given under our hands the 7<sup>th</sup> of March 1866, at Fort Monroe  
Benjamin Harrison, which was sworn to be Recorded —

The Account Current of the Estate of Samuel Rowes etc from the day returned  
and sworn to be recorded —

The account Current of the Estate of Missaph Doyner deceased was this day  
returned and sworn to be recorded —

The Persons appointed Proceffion Masters for Precinct No. 5 by a former  
oyer of this Court this day made their report in the words and figures following to wit —  
An obserue to an oyer of the worshipful Court of Southampton bearing date  
August Court 1815, we have grettly proceffioned all the Lands lying Between  
Leach's Creek water and black water that in seven days, except the line between  
Simon Baynes and Daniel Baynes, and were there before by the said Simon  
Baynes. Given under our hands the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1866, of Samuel E. Baynes  
Davis J. Baynes. Which was sworn to be recorded —

The Persons appointed by a former oyer of this Court, to name <sup>and to nominate</sup>  
one convenient place where to meet at the Publick or to transact in  
opening a road. This day made their report in the words and figures following to wit —  
Agreeable to an oyer of the County Court of Southampton to us aforesaid hands set  
October Court 1816, for the undersigned have named the road to be kept John  
Lambeth as by the oys we were required and find the same to be urgent  
as far as we think the said descent. Given under our hands and seal the  
11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1866 — James Jones, William Doyner, which was  
sworn to be recorded —
