Richard Dawson is appointed overseer of the road from near James Brown farm at a Town fork to the Town fork in the opposite side of Brown farm. And it is ordered that the road laboring Whittier who usually works thereon do attend and assist the same Surveyor in repairing the same road when required.

Ordered that Benjamin Blank, Justice Williams and Thomas R. Shells or any two of them do examine State and Tolls the accounts of the administration of Henry Barrow on the estate of Thomas R. Shells, and make a report thereof to the Court.

George Gurley Book who was summoned to attend this Court to qualify as an overseer of the Road and the lower district of Court duties Books for this County, this day appeared and thereupon took the Court Oath and declared by law.

About Benjamin Griffin, Sheriff Hunt Camp Book Sectors.

Leith Nicholas who was summoned to attend this Court to qualify as an overseer of the Road and being ill, namely called came not. Therefore it is ordered by the Court that accordingly ordered that he be summoned to the next Court to the same cause if any reason for himself, why an attachment should not issue against him, for such his contempt aforesaid appear to the Court.

The Person appointed by a former order of this Court, to let the repairs of Moses Lovings to the lowest bidder, this day made their report on the work and figures following: This may certify that agreeable to an order of the County Court of Loudoun County to a certain month undesignated, also on the month of February 1876 let the repairs of Moses Lovings to the lowest bidder, after advertising the time and place of letting, agreeable to an order of Henry Mason because the undersigned for the term of thirty days, to be made in and have this 20th day of May 1876. Shells as guaranties, this day came to trial the Plaintiff, as the said James R. Shells is a person who has been known to the Court as the Defendant in the term of Henry Walker with interest, declares that he does not recollect the Defendant in the term of Henry Walker with interest, to be Guilty after the order of the Court for a return from the first day of January 1876 due and that the Defendant not appearing through Henry Walker, called and appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that the defendant is not in the Court and is appearing to the satisfaction of the Court.
