sum of One hundred Dollars conditioned as the law directs with respect to a grant
of license for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Lee deceased
in due form

Ordered that Edmund Bennett, Isaac Bennett, William Bryant and John Burt
or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace of this County,
do appear in and swear to the true and personal estate of William Lee
deceased and return the appraisement to the Court

Ordered that Jacob Bane, Isaac Bryant and John Lawson or any two of
them do examine the account of the administration on the
estate of Andrew Britt deceased, and make a report thereof to the Court

On the motion of John Boykin who makes oath and testifies with James
Swain, James Howell and James Bennett he testifies interest into and acknowledges
a bond in the sum of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs
with respect to a grant of license for obtaining letters of administration on the estate
