About John B. May Present James Jones Youth Justice

On the motion of Jacob Barnett who makes oath and testifies with James Howell and Samuel Jackson he surrenders interest into and acknowledges a bond on the penalty of One hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs Intestate a grantee him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Reed deceased in due form.

Ordered that Spurgeon Bennett, Isaac Bennett, William Bryant and John Batt or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace of this County do appraise the personal estate the heirs of any and personal estate of William Reed deceased and return the appraisement to the Court.

Ordered that Jacob Bane, Isaac Bryant and John Branson or any two of them do examine State and settle the account of the administration on the estate of Andrew Britt deceased, and make abstract thereof to the Court.

On the motion of John Boykin who makes oath and testifies with Samuel Jackson, James Howell and James Barnett he surrenders interest into and acknowledges a bond on the penalty of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Intestate a grantee him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of James Boykin deceased, in due form.

Ordered that Laurence Cook, William Phillips, Samuel Cook and James Taylor or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace of this County do appraise and bargain money the heirs of any and personal estate of James Boykin deceased and return the appraisement to the Court.

The Commissioner appointed by a former order of this Court to prepare to take a return of the land of James Morrow Lewis Williams deceased died before and resigned. It being the law attested to the Williams as he is indeed known by it's the day make this report in the words and figures following to wit:

"An Obsequies is a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date June 18th 1815 after giving reasonable notice of the time and place, was lawfully procured to sell at Public Sale the tract of Land named in said decree and known in the division of the Land of which James Williams died before by 1813. Thomas Baiton became the purchaser at one hundred and twenty two dollars and after deducting eight dollars and forty cents for Commission leave one hundred and forty three dollars and forty cents which was divided into eight equal parts and having taken eight separate bonds with sufficient security as the Court directs, March 30<sup>th</sup> 1816, Benjamin Baiton, Richard A. Williams" Whereupon it is ordered that the heirs and the executor and the heirs of the late James Morrow Lewis and his heirs and assigns be and they be bound to the heirs of the late James Morrow Lewis and his heirs and assigns in the proportion of the bonds received by them &c.
