To every Appomattox and Reward Recd who were severally commanded to attend this Court to present divers more I humbly beseech but have not therfore therfore it is ordered that they severally make their fees until his opinion in the divers respects aforesaid of the Commonwealth in the sum of eight dollars each for the sum of the last mentioned and if they appear here on or before the next Court and their fees cause to be certified —

Teward Lucy having this day produced to the Court the bill of receipt for the amount of 700 imposed by Law on hawkers and pedlers trading in goods, wares and merchandise of foreign growth and manufacture. Therefore it is ordered that the said Teward Lucy be permitted to trade as a hawker and pedler and retail goods, wares and merchandise of foreign growth and manufacture until the first day of May next ensuing —

Jacob Barnes this day produced to the Court the bill of receipt for the amount of 20 imposed by Law on hawkers and pedlers trading in goods, wares and merchandise of foreign growth and manufacture. Therefore it is ordered that the said Jacob Barnes be permitted to trade as a hawker and pedler and retail goods, wares and merchandise of foreign growth and manufacture until the first of May next ensuing —

Ordered that Arthur Williamson, David Myrick & William Harris or any two of them do examine State and Settle the account of the Administrator of Betsy D Smith in the State of Pennsylvania deceased, and make a report thereof to the Court —

Ordered that Benjamin Whitfield be appointed Surveyor of the road from Hopewell road to the fork of the road near Brown's Ferry in the name of Joseph Turner who is deceased and it is ordered that the male labouring Settlers who usually makes thorow as attire and open the said Surveyor in repairing the said road where required —

Upon the petition of James Jackson Settler forth that he is bounde with a bond by J. Turner now Bley Powell his wife his wife faithfully administered on the estate of Joseph Turner deceased viz that he affeigned himself to be in charge of sufficient men by him bound or otherwise. It is ordered that the said Bley Powell have Chas. Bowles and William Powell be Subscribers to the next Court to give security for the administration of his affairs on said deceased estate —

Ordered that John Fox, Henry Webb and hollow Kitchin or any two of them do set the repairs or rectoring (as they may think fitful) of the bridge over Wetherby River at Somersett to the Throst insulating taking bond with good Surety for the faithful performance of the said insulating, his that they or such of them as may act make report thereof to the Court —
