

We have taken four bonds with approved security from the purchaser in the name of the person respectively entitled thereto as follows (To Wit) one for the part of the bonds in money for able to Jacob Danvers one for one other the part thereof for able to Joseph D. Bate, Chairman of Elliott Whitehead, Rogers Whitehead and Jonathan Whitehead infant children of Richard Whitehead due one for one other the part thereof for able to Nathan O. Whitehead, and one for the remaining three parts thereof for able to Joseph B. Whitehead. To each of whom you have delivered the said Bonds. We then proceed to divide the down money of the said planter Whitehead deceased in the estate of his said husband into five equal parts as follows (To Wit) To Nathan O. Whitehead one apiece of \$1000 Bow Valued at five hundred dollars, he paying to Catherine Whitehead \$1000 the sum of forty nine dollars, fifteen 15/100 cents. The apiece to Jacob Danvers \$1000 Lucy and Abby Valued at four hundred and fifty five dollars he paying to \$1000 the sum of four dollars and 75/100 cents. The apiece to Catherine Whitehead \$1000 Fanny Valued at three hundred and twenty five dollars. To Joseph D. Bate as Executor aforesaid, We apiece \$1000 \$96 Rella, Jem, Roger and Sarah Valued at nine hundred and twenty five dollars, making two whole shares, he paying to \$1000 the sum of twenty two dollars 75/100 cents, due to Joseph B. Whitehead \$1000 the sum of fifty dollars and 83/100 cents making in the whole which Joseph D. Bate has to pay to the legatees the sum of twenty three dollars and 83/100 cents and the amount which Catherine Whitehead receives from the other legatees is twenty five dollars and 83/100 cents. We also have apiece to Joseph B. Whitehead \$1000 Jonathan and Chiles Abby Valued four hundred dollars the amount of Valuations of the above have is two thousand seven hundred and four dollars and 83/100 cents which have divided into five equal parts, given to each legatee, the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars and eighty three and 1/100 cents.
