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The Commissions appointed by a former Court of this Court to lay off an office to Dorothy Whitney, widow of John Whitney, ended one third of the same (other of the one) because formerly lived as well the share of the said of the late John Whitney, which he had before and before. This day made their report in the words and figures following (to wit) "Equally to any part of the County Court of Southampton to as divides bearing date January 18th 1776 One the Commissions have proceeded to Survey and divide the lands of John Whitney Junr. and also with certainty of course as by the order we now requires and have laid off the lands of said deceased and divided to Dorothy Whitney, widow and child of the said deceased, one third part of all the lands formerly belonging to the said John Whitney Junr. deceased and also two thirds in the lands of Francis Whitney deceased which lands we divide to him by his father in his lifetime, and his mother in law not making her right. Therefore the was entitled to receive and as the said Francis Whitney had killed one part of his land by sell to the said John Whitney & as all the land is now in the possession of John and Dorothy Whitney, we have signed Dorothy Whitney's order to her in, in all the said lands bearing regard to quality as well as quantity by proper metes and bounds to her for life. Given under our hands this 17th day of July 1776, William Jones Jonathan Suter, Benjamin Wilson, Pelham Johnson" (Whereupon it is denied and ordered that the foregoing report be held firm stable and binding between the parties and that the Clerk be proportionally bound between them

On the motion of Elizabeth Hensley she made oath and together with George Whitcomb and Charles Holt her Trustees intercomitted and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars to be returned as the Law directs Certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Hamilton Hensley deceased in due form

Ordered that Isaac Bousall, Rowell Bep, Owen Myrick and Myatt Barham or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace of this County, do appear in court next, the term if any one personal estate of Hamilton Hensley deceased and return the appraisement to the Court

On the motion of Rowell Nicholson he is appointed Guardian to John Nicholson orphan of Charles B. Nicholson deceased. Whereupon the said Rowell Nicholson together with Henry Mason Esq. State - Nicholson his executor entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four Thousand Dollars with commission according to Law
