Brown and with a certificate of the Clerk of this County aforesaid certify the acknowledgment of the said James H. Brown taken in open Court of that County which being brought to the Court for record, are ordered to be recorded

On the motion of John Brown a appointed Justice to Robert How of the County of Loudoun James H. Brown, who upon the 1st of June 1801 together with Richard D. Brown and James H. Brown his wife and children entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred Dollars, with conditions according to Law
