Myrick, Esq; Joshua Clifford, Branch M. Buell, James Foster, Henry Melo, Henry  
B Vaughan, John Chapman, William D Daughtry, Henry Johnson, Matthew  
Balister, Spencer Pierce and Henry Gurley who being deponents and I sworn upon the  
true copies upon the other Plea of Payment brought into Court a copy of the  
words and figures following to wit "We the Jury find for the Plaintiff the debt  
in the declaration mentioned and upon the account to one cent." Therefore It is  
concluded by the court that the Plaintiff recover against the defendant  
Twenty Pounds nine Shillings the debt aforesaid together with his damages aforesaid  
in sum aforesaid apaid her but by him about his suit in the behalf of persons  
to be heirs of the goods and chattels of the deceased in the hands of the defendant  
to be assimilated if so much thereof he had but if not then the debt aforesaid to  
be lesse of his own proper goods and chattels and the same defendant no money.  
But this judgment to be discharged by the payment of Two Pounds nine  
Shillings and Six pence with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of 6%  
per annum per annum from the Thirteenth day of January 1797 until the time  
of Payment and the costs —

debts aforesaid to be lesse of due goods and chattels of the deceased in the hands of  
the defendant if so much thereof he had to be assimilated but if not then the  
debts aforesaid to be lesse of his own proper goods and chattels also the same defendant  
no money. But this Judgment is to be discharged by the payment of Eleven  
Pounds Nine Shillings and four Pence with interest thereon to be computed after
