Joseph Wright was this day set to the bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed, charged with stealing taking and carrying away one sheep, the property of a certain Solomon Coff, of the value of two dollars on the twenty eighth day of July last past (The Court which were summoned for his examination failing to attend), and several matters appeared and were sworn on behalf of the Commonwealth, to wit Mills Beale and Homer Holt who being examined touching the premises, The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the Case are of opinion that the Prisoner is guilty of the Petit Larceny whereof he stands charged, and he ought to be fined for the said offence at the next Superior Court to be holden in and for this County on the seventh day of September next And therefore he is remanded to Jail

Be it remembered That Mills Beale and Solomon Coff of this County here in Court acknowledge themselves to be indebted unto his excellency Wilson Cary Nicholas Esquire Governor or Chief magistrate of this Commonwealth in the sum of \$100 each of them respectively and sundry goods and chattels to be valued and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth, sundry, yet upon this Court's oath that the said Mills Beale and Solomon Coff shall lawfully make, their personal appearance before the Judges of the Superior Court to be holden in and for this County on the seventh day of September next to give answer on behalf of the Commonwealth of South Carolina, and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Judges their due recognizance to be void

Samuel Brorone a free man of Coleridge, was this day set to the bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed charged with having on the day of last past stolen taken and carrying away from the house of Joseph Murray of this County two bushels of fine brown the property of said Murray of the value of two dollars. (The Court which were summoned for his examination, failing to attend) (The prisoner by his counsel moves the Court to discharge him, because the said offence was not sufficiently set forth in the warrant to summon the Court for his examination) there being no crime set forth in the warrant, The Court after fully
