

The Person appointed by a former order of this Court to Report the Commission.

 is opened from the Pine Ridge Road at Arthur Bowring, to the Black Creek meeting
 road and Black Creek meeting house. This day we are then report on the words
 and terms following to wit: "Agreeable to an order of the County Court
 of Southampton to wit, in relation to the Commission held on the 9th day of
 July 1816, Viewed the Situation of the opening a road from the Pine Ridge
 road at Arthur Bowring to the Black Creek meeting road and Black Creek meeting
 house, we hereby state that we have Importantly Viewed the Commission
 and circumstances attending the same, and we are fully of the opinion
 that the Commission will every much result to the good of the People as
 large, we think that the opening of said road will not injure themselves
 but Very Little. It will bear the most on Arthur Bowring, if the road
 should be extended, of any other Person, the road if opened will be
 Very convenient, in a number of instances, It will run through the lands
 of James Jones, James Benson and Patsy Benson, Richard Wadsworth, James
 Johnson, Elly Joyner, Jeremiah Joyner, and Arthur Bowring, and if
 extended as through the lands of Benjamin Griffin, Elah Woodhew,
 Elizabeth Griffin, John Castagnier, Samuell Bennett and Thomas Bouff
 and Elly Castagnier. We are fully of opinion that it will be one of the
 most convenient roads, for the benefit of the same that we have in
 this County, or at least so much so. The extension of the said road
 will be from the Pine Ridge road at Arthur Bowring, here to the road
 hill road at Thomas Bouff. Given under our hands this 15th of July 1816
 "James Jones, William Joyner." Whereupon It is ordered that the
 Several Persons through whose lands the said road is proposed to be opened
 be summoned to the next Court to show Cause if any they can why the said
 road should not be opened as proposed.

The person appointed by a former order of this Court to View and
 report the practicability of building a bridge across the Hottoway River near
 Brown Ferry this day we are then Report on the words following to wit:
 "In obedience to an order of the worshipful The County Court of
 Southampton, we have examined the water of near Brown Ferry and
 It is our opinion that a Bridge may be Built about 40 or 50 yds
 below the said Ferry, without any difficulty, as it respects the width
 of the water and formation of the river. Given under our hands this 19th
 day of August 1816, Richard Hilders, Hyman Rockelle, William Phillips
 Southampton. Which was ordered to be Recorded.

Ordered that the Justice of the Peace of this County be Summoned to the
 next Court, by the Sheriff to say whether or not a bridge shall be erected
 near Brown Ferry agreeable to the Commission report thereof.

Ordered that the master of the Commission, as examine late and settle the account
 of Benjamin Woodhew & associates as the estate Lucy Woodhew of whom of
 William Woodhew deceased, and make a report thereof to the Court.
