The Person appointed Commissioner by a former order
 of the Court to make partition and division in a certain tract or parcel of
 land, whereof Thomas Fitzhugh was Legatee and possessor. This day made his
 report in the more and figures following to wit: & Agreed to an order
 of the County Court of Salisbury to be directed bearing date June fourth
 1785. We the undersigned do hereby give on the lands of the said John Fitzhugh
 deceased attested with the Court Surveyor, as by the order now made
 required and have run out the same and find there to be 300 Acres
 to wit the Crowned lands in the main body of the Mill Pond and we have
 also laid off and surveyed the same among the Legates of the said deceased
 in manner and form, following (to wit) Beginning at a hyphen, running
 on the Side of the Mill Pond and a corner in Thomas Fitzhugh's lot
 No 1 running thence S. 63. E. Pole to a new corner made in
 Thomas Fitzhugh's lot No 1 and Henry Parker's lot No 2 thence along the winding
 line of the said lot No 1 & 2. S. 28. W. 62 pole to a Post, a new corner made in lot
 No 1. S. 8 and 4. thence along the winding line of lot No 1 and 4. S. 43. W. to a
 new corner made in Francis Mielup's out Boundary line, thence along his
 line to the Mill Pond, and thence down the various courses of the high
 lands north of the said Pond to a Cypress, a new corner made in Elizabeth
 Fitzhugh's mill lot No 2, thence S. 47. West 40 pole to a new corner of lot
 No 1 and 2. thence S. 63. E. 40 pole to a Possum Tree a new corner made in
 the mill lot No 2 thence S. 47. W. 40 pole to a Cypress, a new corner made
 in lot No 2 standing on the Side of the Mill Pond, thence down the
 said run to the first Station, containing 135. Acres, which lot was devised by
 Thomas Fitzhugh being lot No 1 which is his full Proportional part of all
 the lands of the said John Fitzhugh deceased. Also lot No 2 being the mill lot
 containing 10 Acres besides the Crowned lands of the main body of the mill
 Pond which lot was devised by Elizabeth Fitzhugh and bounded as follows
 to wit Beginning at a hyphen, a new corner made standing on the Side
 of the mill Pond, thence S. 47. E. 40 pole to a Possum Tree a new
 corner made in lot No 1 and 2, thence S. 55. W. 40 pole thence S. 47. 40 pole
 to a small Cypress, standing on the edge of the mill Pond thence down the
 said Pond to the mill Pond and down the mill race to the first Station
 being her Proportional part of the said lands. Also lot No 3 being the house
 and orchard lot containing 20 Acres which lot was devised by Henry Parker
 in right of his wife and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a new
 corner made in the Indian line, running thence S. 28. W. 62 pole to a Post
 a new corner of lot No 1. S. 8 and 4. thence S. 63. E. 62 pole to a Post Tree a
 new corner made in lot No 3. thence S. 28. W. 62 pole to a new corner made
 in the Indian line again, thence S. 55. W. 62 pole to the first Station, being
 Henry Parker's proportional part of the said lands. The right of his wife Mary
 Fitzhugh's lot No 4 being the upper lot containing 150 Acres bounded by John
 Fitzhugh and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a new corner made
