It is therefore ordered that the said Howell Myrick, have leave to for that purpose upon his pay the day imposed by law on ordinaries, which is accordingly done, and comes to the interest of Record.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County collect from John Fichlow, the Sum of Eighty Dollars, It being the amount of his bond taken for the purchase of the old Jail, and account with the Court according to Law.

Ordered that Henry Briggs, Benjamin Dwaney and William Doymen or any two of them, do examine the State and Title the account of the administrator of the Estate of James Jackson deceased and make a report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that the order of the last Court, committing the Estate of William Gales to the Sheriff of this County of Southampton County, be executed and this same is hereby accordingly recorded, which was ordered to the interest of Record.

The Last will and Testament of Dianna Pitman deceased was proved by the oath of Mary Vaper and Leobica Evans the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Miller Willows the Executor named in the said Will who prays oath thereto and together with Lewis A Branch and James Vaper his executor enters into and acknowledges a bond in the Penalty of fifteen hundred Dollars conditioned as the law directs to be given for obtaining a probat thereof in due form.

Ordered that John Mayten John Vaper, Richard Stephenson and James Vaper or any three of them being first sworn before the Justice of the Peace do, hear and duly appraise in current money, all the Personal Estate of Dianna Pitman deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

Ordered that I doth Dwaney, Richard Dillard & John Parker or any two of them do examine the State and Title the account of the administrator of the Estate of Robert Johnson deceased and make a report thereof to the Court.
