Thereupon came also a Jury to wit Richard B Day, Joseph Mills Fairclough, Johnson Pope, Darius Cotton, Bolling Barnes, John Law, Joshua Joyner, James Millikin, Thomas B Powell, Henry Johnson, Theophilus Joyner, and Ely Joyner who being sworn the truth to speak upon the Oath sworn, brought into Court a verdict in the words following to wit: "We of the Jury find for the Plaintiff the debt in the declaration mentioned and also his damage to one Cent." Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the said defendant the Sum of thirty three pounds eighteen Shilling and four pence the debt aforesaid together with his damages aforesaid in form aforesaid specified and his costs by him about his Suit in this behalf expended. But this Judgment is to be discharged by the Payment of Seventeen pounds nineteen Shillings and two pence with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of Six per Centum per annum from the first day of January 1812 until the time of Payment and the costs, to be levied of the goods and chattels of the decedent in the hands of the defendant to be administered if so much thereof he hath, but if not then the costs aforesaid to be levied of his own proper goods and chattels also the said defendant in mercy &c
