Ordered that James Tappan and James Rochelle do examine the
Hills account as Curator of James T. Hicks, orphan of Josiah Hicks deceased and make
a report thereof to the Court

Ordered that Henry Welsh, Joshua Fort and Oliver Kitchers do examine the
bridge built at Jerusalem across the river, by John Richtow, and report to the
Court whether the same is completed agreeable to Contract entered into for the
completion of the same by the said John Richtow. It is also ordered that the said
Commissioners make Sale of the timber composing the said bridge - requiring of
the Purchase bond with ^{to be supplied} approved Security, for and towards the repairing the same

Jesse Williams who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer
the Complaint of Rey Griffin against him for a breach of the Peace, appears
personally with the said Griffin and Williams being fully heard together with
all the circumstances of the case. The Court are of opinion and accordingly order
that the said Jesse Williams give Security for his good behaviour for the term of
Twelve months, that is to say himself in the Sum of One thousand and fifty
dollars with two Securities to be named with him in the Sum of Seventy five
dollars each. Whereupon the said Jesse Williams with Jere Beale and Harrison
Griffin his Securities, here in Court, severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted
to his Excellency Wilson Lang Nicholas Esquire Governor or Chief magistrate of this
Commonwealth, the said Jesse Williams in the Sum of One thousand and fifty
dollars and the said Jere Beale and Harrison Griffin in the Sum of Seventy five
dollars each, of their respective lands and Tenements, goods and chattels to be
seized, and to the said Governor and his Successors, for the use of the Commonwealth
renowned. Yet upon this condition that if the said Jesse Williams shall keep the
Peace, and of good behaviour, towards all the Citizens of this Commonwealth
more especially towards the said Rey Griffin for the term of Twelve months
from this day as aforesaid then this recognizance to be void

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County into whose hands the estate of Willis
Williams was committed pay to Isaac Noble the Sum of
Eleven dollars the amount of his account also account thereof with the Court
at the next of this motion -
