of the jury find for the Plaintiff the debt in the declaration mentioned, with interest
from the eighth day of Octr 1808 till Paid. We also find that the defendant hath
fully administered the goods and chattels, rights and credit of his Testator which came
to his hands to his administration, except as to the sum of \$45.22 we further find that
a fragment was reserved, in the County Court of Southampton at November Term 1816
against the defendant in behalf James Harrison as Executor to Henry L. Williams, for the
sum of £6.10.6 with int. from the 27th Decr 1812, which is a debt of Superior
dignity to the Plaintiff demands and we further find the Plaintiff damaged to one cent
Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the debt
the sum of Fifty Seven pounds eight shillings and three pence three farthings with interest
thereon to be computed after the rate of Six per Centum per annum from the eighth
day of October 1808 till Paid the debt aforesaid, together with his damages aforesaid
in full aforesaid, apayed, and his costs by him about his Suit in this behalf expenses
to be paid of the goods and chattels of the decedent where sufficient appts shall come
to the hands of the defendant to his administration, after first paying and satisfying
James Harrison Executor to Henry L. Williams, the sum of Eight pounds ten shillings
and six pence with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of Six per Centum
per annum from the 27th Decr 1812 till Paid, and the said defendant
in money to Subject to the following orders to wit: £2.14.0 Paid, Octr 10th 1808
