

Schaboo Johnson who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance this day to answer the complaints of the Commonwealth against a breach of the Peace, appearing accordingly, whereupon the Court fully heard, it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Schaboo Johnson give Security for his good behaviour for Twelve Months that is to say, himself in the Sum of four hundred dollar with two Sureties to be bound with him in the Sum of two hundred dollar each, whereupon the said Schaboo Johnson with John and Richard Murphy his Sureties entered into and acknowledged themselves to be indebted here in Court to his excellency James O. Enys Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth the said Johnson in the Sum of four hundred dollar and the said John and Richard Murphy in the Sum of two hundred dollar each in respective bond and Surements good and Chancell to be levied on our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth, yet upon this condition that if the said Schaboo Johnson keeps the Peace and be of good behaviour towards all the Citizens of this Commonwealth, for the term of Twelve months as above then this obligation is to be void.

Francis Felt, who stands bound by recognizance to appear day to answer the complaint of the Commonwealth against breach of the Peace, appeared accordingly and the parties heard. It is the opinion of the Court that accordingly order be he discharged from his recognizance and further prosecuted in this case.
