The person heretofore appointed commissioners to make partitions and division
of the Slave of William Evans dec^d This day make their report in the words and
figure following to wit " Agreeably to an order of the worshipful Court of
Bathampton County dated March Court 1817, appointing Commissioners to divide and
sell the Slave and other personal estate of William Evans dec^d. We William Doughty and Henry Gurley acting Commissioners have proceeded in
the following manner (to wit) We have allotted to Mary Ann Barr late
Mary Ann Evans one third part of the slave, belonging to the estate of William Evans
dec^d which whole amount is estimated at \$3450.00. To her the said Mary Ann
Barr, Negroes in Value of \$1150.00. also one moiety of the one third part the
portion of the Slave intended, under the will of William Evans dec^d for his son
Benjamin W. Evans who is now dec^d which amount of the one moiety is \$575.00
making in amount to the said Mary Ann Barr \$1725.00 for life also we have
allotted to William T Evans Son of William Evans dec^d one third part of the Slave
belonging to said Estate in amount \$1150 also the other moiety of the one third
part of Slave intended for Benjamin W. Evans now dec^d which amount is \$575.00
making in amount in Slave to said William T Evans \$1725.00. Also we the said
Commissioners, have proceeded to sell on a Credit of twelve months the other personal
estate (exclusive of Slave) which amount of Sale is \$362 and have allotted and allowed
to the said Mary Ann Barr - in amount \$120.00 - one third part of the proceeds of
said Sale - also in amount one moiety of the one third part of such proceeds which
is \$60.34 making in amount to her \$181. - also unto William T Evans one third part
of the proceeds from said Sale \$120.00 - also one moiety of the one third which
is \$60.34 making in amount to him the said William T Evans \$181 which said
Sum together with the above amount of proceeds from the sales of said estate
is returned to Richard V Williams guardian to the said William T Evans and
received of the estate of William Evans dec^d given under our hand this 21st
