The Plaintiff having obtained an attachment of the defendant who has previously removed out of this County, and the Court himself so that the ordinary process of law cannot be served for debt due by account and the Constable having made return that executed the said attachment "on one key a looking glass" this day Plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being solemnly called to appear the same. It is considered by the Court, that the recovery against the defendant Eighteen dollars and thirty five cents his debt aforesaid proves to be just also five dollars and fifty cents by him in this behalf expending, and it is further ordered that the Sheriff make sale of the looking glass aforesaid by the Constable as the law directs and out of the money arising from such sale satisfy this Judgment to the Plaintiff, and return the surplus to the defendant, and return an account of such sale to Judge Day.

Ordered that James Jones, William Boyden and Joseph Lathford or any two of them, as examiners State and settle the accounts of the administration of the Estate of Jeremiah Whitney and make a report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that the Overseers of the poor bind out the Whittels, Samuels Whittels, and Browne Glover poor children, as to law.

Benjamin Dwaney who has been appointed an Overseer of the poor in this County for the lower district on Monday next appeared in Court and took the several oaths prescribed.

Silas Sumnerell is by the Court recommended to his Excellency James P. Preston Esquire Governor or Chief Magistrate of the Commonwealth, to be Captain of a Company of Militia in the 65th Regiment 8th Brigade and 4th Division of Militia, in the room of Arthur Hollenans resigned, and to be Lieutenant in the said Company in the room of one promoted.

On account current of the Estate of James Jones this day returned and ordered to be recorded.

Sally Powell (a free negro) who was to answer the Complaint of James Jones was this day set to the Court but came not, and nothing further. It is therefore ordered that she forfeit.

On the motion of Sprague receipt for the tax imposed by the Court ordered that the said Sprague receive his house in this County for the term of entering into bond, with Sufficient.

Ordered that the Sheriff of the Estate of Solomon Turner debt. having the sum of four dollars, the amount of the motion, and account thereof with.
