 It is therefore ordered that she forthwith be discharged from this prosecution

On the motion of Spradley Williams, who produces the Clerk's
 receipt for the tax imposed by Law on ordinary keepers. It is therefore
 ordered that the said Spradley Williams have licence to keep an ordinary at
 his house in this County for the term of one year, from this time upon his
 entering into bond with sufficient security in the Clerk's office

 the Estate of Solomon Turner dec'd hath been committed, pay to Benjamin D. Dyer
 the sum of four dollars, the amount of his account, also 62 cents costs of

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to make partition and
 division of the Estate of John Day dec'd, this day made their report in the
 word and figures following (to wit) "Southampton County (S.C.) Agreeable
 to a decree of the Court of the County aforesaid, in a Suit in Chancery in
 which Mary Ann Day widow of John Day deceased, Complainant, Edwin
 Turner administrator of John Day and administratrix of his late wife Martha D. deceased
 Defendants we have proceeded to divide the Slaves belonging to the said John
 Day deceased as were produced to us as follows. We assign unto the Complainant
 Mary Ann Day during her natural life the following Slaves to wit, Negroes
 Ben. Harby, Luke, Henry, Mason, Wmmy, Dick, Jacob, Tom, Dolly and
 Mariah, by her assigning to the Estate fifteen dollars, this sum being that
 which in value was the one third part of the before named Slaves -
 we further proceeded to divide the remaining two thirds in five equal
 parts amongst the legates - to wit we assign unto Richard B. Day the
 following Slaves, Orison, Jacob and Sucky and to receive from Edwin Turner
 administrator of his late wife Martha D. deceased the sum of Six dollars, it
 being his distributive share. we assign unto Edmund L. Day, the following
 Slaves, Tom, Phill, Lucy, Lucinda, and John, and to receive from
 Edwin Turner administrator of his late wife Martha D. dec'd thirty one dollar
 it being his distributive share - we assign to John Ann Day the following
