Boscawen his Sureties entered into and acknowledge a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted the said Francis Riesley for obtaining letters of administration on the said decedent's estate with his wife annexed in due form.

On the motion of Francis Riesley who made oath and together with Thomas Riesley and William B. Boscawen his Sureties entered into and acknowledge a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted the said Francis Riesley for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Lewis P. Hart decd in due form.

Ordered that Henry Melcher, Collier Kitcher, Henry Gurley and John Luckless or any three of them being first sworn by a Justice of the Peace do well and truly appraise in current money all the personal estate of Lewis P. Hart decd and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

For a negro man slave the property of Allen Bingham of the County of Erie of right was this day set to the bar in pursuance of the Sheriff of this County in whose custody he was heretofore committed (The Court summoned for his trial not having met) And charged with having in the night time of the first month of June last past feloniously & unlawfully broken and entered into the mansion house of Peter Pisch of the County of Southampton take, steal and carry away nine pieces of linen and thirty weight of lace, of the value of twenty dollars and being thereof arraigned and upon his arraignment pled not guilty and for his trial put himself upon God and this Court thereupon took oaths were sworn and examined on the part of the Commonwealth, testifying the premises to wit Peter Pisch, Bailey Davis and Lewis Johnson, whereupon the Court after fully hearing the prisoner by William H. Prosser who was assigned him as Counsel learned in the Law all well all circumstances attending the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty Therefore it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from his imprisonment.
