in his mind the prisoner took a spade and he went with this deponent
to Davis and Abraham Liggins Homes, they then went over Black water river
Isaac the prisoner had a piece of rope with which he tried to open
the back house of the said Peter Purcell but could not succeed in doing
to then went round the house with the spade and dug under the house and got
a piece of bacon and a quantity of land the prisoner at the bar carried three
of the bacon and the quarter part of the land and deposited it in one of the
houses of his master Allen Fulgham, and that the deponent took the other three
pieces and the remainder of the land and carried it to his the deponent's wife
and buried it in the garden. The evidence being thus closed on the part of the
Commonwealth. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances
before it upon mature deliberation has, and its opinion unanimously that
Isaac is guilty of the burglary whereof he stands charged, whereupon it
ordered that he be taken from thence to the place from whence he came and from
thence to the place of his confinement, the 21st day of November next between the hours of ten o'clock
and three o'clock P. M. of that day to the place of usual detention, and
there to be kept by the warden till he is dead, dead, The Court from the
evidence and the evidence in this case recommends to the Executive Council
that it should transport the said Slave Isaac -

The Court, values the said Slave Isaac to four hundred and fifty dollars

It is remembered that Thomas Williford with Burrill Westbrook and James
the President, have in Court acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency
the President of the Governor and Chief Magistrate of the Commonwealth the said
Williford in the sum of one hundred dollars, the said Burrill Westbrook
James Foster each in the sum of fifty dollars of their respective lands and
goods and chattels to be levied in the said Governor and his Executors for
the Commonwealth's use. Yet upon this Condition that if the said
Williford shall personally appear before the Justices of our County Court
at their Court house on the Third Monday in November next then
the sum of that debt or by any Court of law, then this recognizing and
otherwise to remain in full force and virtue -
