The Commissioner heretofore appointed to make sale of a certain tract of land
John River deceased, as well as a portion of the proceeds, this day made their report in the
following manner (to wit) "A quærelle is an order of the County Court of Southampton
dated September 19th 1815, we have put up at public sale the lands
of John and Mary River deceased on a credit of twelve months which sales amounts to the
sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars and eighteen cents, which money we
have divided in the following manner (to wit) To John River we have assigned the
sum of one hundred and twenty seven dollars and fifty four cents being his
proportionable part arising from the sales of the said lands, To Robert River we have
assigned the sum of one hundred and twenty seven dollars and fifty four cents
being his proportionable part arising from the sales of the said lands. To John
Nicholson and wife we have assigned the sum of eighty five dollars and four
cents being his proportionable part arising from the sales of said lands. To Charlotte
Fitzhugh we have assigned the sum of eighty five dollars four cents being his
proportionable part arising from the sales of the said lands. Given under our hands
and seals this 13th day of July 1816. David Myrick Clerk, David Westbrock
Deputy Clerk" Whereupon It is decreed and ordered by Court, that the
report be laid upon the table and binding between the parties and that the costs
be proportionably borne between them —

On the motion of John Morrip who made oath and together with Peter Boothe
and John Westbrock his Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of
one thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted the said John Morrip
for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Sally Morrip deceased in due form

Ordered that Humphrey, Drury, Brewster Rawlings, Jeph Blane and John
Morrison or any three of them being first sworn, as well and truly appraise in current
money all the personal Estate of Sally Morrip deceased and return the appraisement
under their hands to the Court —

John Morrip is by the Court appointed guardian to Henry Dole, James and
Sally Morrip orphans of Sally Morrip deceased, whereupon the said John Morrip
together with Peter Boothe and John Westbrock his Securities entered into and acknowledged
a bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars with a condition as the law
directs —

Barwood Dole orphan of Arthur Dole deceased this day made choice of
James Boykin as and for his guardian with the assent of the Court, whereupon
the said Boykin together with Richard P. Blument and Benjamin Griffin his
Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two thousand
dollars with a condition as the law directs —
