sum of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs.

of sound mind, whereupon the said Isaac Cloud together with Henry Guiley and Johnson
his Sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of fifteen
hundred dollars with Condition as the law directs.

The last will and testament of Arthur Williams and was this day proved by the
oath of Edward Butler, John Fowler and William Beale the witnesses thereto and
ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of William Williams the executor therein
named who made oath thereto and together with John Fowler and Jordan Edwards
his Sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of Two thousand
dollars a Certificate is granted the said William Williams for obtaining a probat-
thereof in due form.

Ordered that William Edwards, Jacob Johnson, James Boyner and
Cyrus Edwards or any three of them, being first sworn by a Justice of the peace do
sell and truly appraise in current money all the personal Estate of Arthur Williams
deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

William Carr, who stands indicted for Hog stealing, was this day
brought to the bar by the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore
committed and thereof arraigned and upon his arraignment, pleaded not guilty
and for his trial put himself upon God and his County. Whereupon came a Jury
consisting of John Pope, Joseph Lane, Samuel Pouns, James Pond, Goodrich Miller,
Peter Pond, William West, William Bowden, Willie Wilkins, James Williams,
and Kinchen Williams who being sworn and James Scott who being
sworn tried and charged, the truth of and upon the premises to say, and after
hearing the evidence, and arguments of Counsel upon their oaths and in solemn form
said that that prisoner is guilty of the offence whereof he stands charged, and
that his punishment be Twenty lashes, and it is ordered that the Sheriff of
this County see execution done and the same being done and performed, and nothing
further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he
be discharged.
