This cause came on this day to be heard upon the bill and answer
of the parties and with the assent of the Court, whereupon the Court

Miller, Aaron, Nim, Frank, Rachel, Barbary and her child named
Lally and her child named Matthew and Emily into six equal
lots and all the same as follows, that is to say, to Lawrence Booth,
John B. Pierce, each one of the said parts, to William
Day, John Day, Nathaniel Richelle and James Turner one of the
parts share and share alike and to John Edwards, Francis Edwards,
Louisa A. Edwards and Samuel Phipps the remaining one
share and share alike, and the Court doth further order and decree
that should the said Commissioners, or such of them as may
be able to make equal and proper division of the said slaves, that they
of them as may act, after giving at least ten days notice public, of the
place of sale are hereby authorized and directed to sell by public auction
a lot of nine months the slaves aforesaid King bonds for the amount of
specie, with good and sufficient security and make report to this Court in
the term next to the final decree.

On the motion of Henry Welsh and James Millikin who
have been as Security for Samuel Calvert his due and faithful executor
of the Estate of Matthew Calvert deceased under that they apprehend them
to be in danger of suffering damages thereby. It is therefore ordered that
said Calvert be summoned to the next Court, to give ^{counter} security for his
executorial proceedings aforesaid.

Ordered that Stewart Harris, Spratley Williams and Thomas Risley
any two of them do examine the accounts of the administration
of the Estate of Benjamin Deek and the Estate of Lucy Biddle and
report thereof separately to the Court.
