The defendant Matthew Gregory, not having entered his appearance
and given security according to the act of assembly and the order of this
Court and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that he is not an
inhabitant of this County, It is therefore decreed and ordered that the
said Matthew Gregory, doth appear here on or before the third Monday in
June next and answer the Complainant's said bill; and that a copy of
this order be forth with inserted in some newspaper, published in the
City of Richmond for two months successively and posted at the front door
of the Court house of this County on two several Court days

John blaus, Phelps blaus, Sipe blaus, William blaus
and Rebecca blaus are insane persons by the said Sipe blaus
Committee appointed by the Court to preserve and take care
of his Estate ----- Complainants

against
Charlotte blaus widow and relict of William blaus dec^d. Deft.
The person appointed by a former decree of this Court to make sale
partition and division of the Estate of William blaus dec^d both real and
personal. This day made their report in the following words, To wit,
"By virtue of the within decree to me directed I have made sale of
the property as directed therein and have divided the proceeds thereof as
directed in the within decree. Given under my hand this 2nd day of
December 1817" Sipe blaus Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that
the foregoing report be held firm, stable and binding between parties
and that the costs be proportionally born between them

On the motion of John Mangumhart, John Mumalt, Nathan Jones
James M. Collier, Henry Gurley, Henry Welch, Arthur Williamson, Edwin
William Simmon and Spradley Williams who severally produced
the Clerk's receipt for the tax imposed by law on owners
of slaves It is therefore decreed and ordered that they severally have leave
to keep an inventory of their houses within this County from this time until the
first day of May next, upon their entering into bond and security in the
usual manner according to law
