Harris, Lewis Harris, Matthew Holcomb, James Mellickin, Joseph Reese Charles
Harrison, Jesse Barnett, Hardy Harris, Joseph Mellow and George T. Williams
who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue then brought
before the Court as versed in the following words To wit, "We the Jury find
for the Plaintiff the sum of sixty seven dollars and twenty nine Cents with
interest thereon from the 18th day of December 1810 till paid." Therefore it
is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the defendant
the sum of Sixty seven dollars and twenty nine Cents with legal interest
thereon from the 18th day of December 1810 till paid. The debt in the declaration
mentioned, and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended To be
paid of the goods and chattels of the defendant in the hands of the defendant
the administrator, if so much thereof he hath of not then the costs afore said
