Whereupon the Court after inspecting the record of the judgment in the Scire facias mentioned, are of opinion that there are no words, and thereupon came a Jury To wit, the issue upon the plea of assumpsit. To wit, John Thomas, John Shepherd, Usher Williams, William Phillips, Mary Maget, John Revell, ^{Joseph Mungall} ^{Arthur Wilson}, George B. Cammer, John Moore, William Williford, Benjamin Williams and Elijah Tarry being duly tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined here into Court a verdict in the following words. To wit: "We the Jury find for the Plaintiff and assess his damages against the defendants to be Sixty six pounds sixteen shillings and six pence, the debt in the sum of thirty Six pounds sixteen shillings and six pence, the Costs by him in this behalf expended, and also the Costs by him in this behalf expended, to gather his damages, aforesaid in four shillings and six pence, the said defendants found, eight shillings and three pence, with interest thereon from the 1st day of May 1813 till paid together with the Costs and damages.
