master, also Belling H. Barnes became the undertaker thereof at the price
of fifty dollars, and we report that the said bridge has been by him built
and completed according to Contract - Given under our hands this 19th day of

and completed agreeably to the terms of letting. Given under our hands this 18th

assign to Benjamin Blunt Lot No. 1. Dolly, Anne, Selvey, Hannah, Peter
Mary and Molly he paying to Lot No. 3. Richard Blunt \$12.50
also Benjamin Blunt being given to Lot No. 2. Richard Blunt, Mary, Frank
Part of Lot No. 2 - we assign to Richard Blunt, which is said
and Mark which is said Richard Blunt Part of Lot No. 2 he paying to Benj.
Blunt part of said Lot the sum of fifty dollars we assign also
