

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th day of February 1819

Present Jeremiah Cobb, Clements Rochelle, Hewitt Harris and Thomas Peltow Esqrs. Justices of the Peace. ^{John B. Broomage Esq.} this day appeared in Court and qualified as attorney at law in this Court which was ordered to be entered of record.

George Bailey's last will and Testament was proved by the oaths of William Hancock and Francis English two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be entered of record. And on the motion of William Bailey the executor therein named who came into Court and together with John Marguhart and John Harris his second executor into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty Thousand dollars conditioned that the said William Bailey for obtaining probate thereof in due form.

Ordered that John Marguhart, John Harris, Wm Hancock and Thomas Peltow or any three of them being first sworn by a Justice of the peace to be true and truly appraisers in current money all the personal Estate of George Bailey and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

Edward N. Branch here in Court refused longer to act as a Justice of the Peace in this County which was ordered to be entered of record.

This Cause was this day docketed by Consent of parties and opened for trial. And was heard on the bills, answers, and arguments of Counsel. And after due consideration thereof had the Court doth adjudge over and above William B. Gooswyn, Francis Risley, Edward Reese, Spradley Williams and Risley or any three of them, do after giving reasonable public notice of time and place of sale, expose the Slaves mentioned in the bills, to public sale on a Credit of Twelve months and divide the proceeds of the sale into eight equal parts and take bonds with security for each separate part, that they deliver one of said bonds to the said Mary, one to the Complainants Thomas Leliston and Nancy his wife in right of said wife, and one to each of the defendants Martha and Arthur, and one to each of the infants defendants, Henry, William, Thomas and Elizabeth Applushite. That they give refunding bonds to the executor of said Hardy Applushite decd. And it is further decreed and ordered that they or such of them as may make a report of their proceedings in the premises to the Court in due time do so.

Samuel Powers guardian to Charles Broomage this day returned an account of said ward and was ordered to be the guardian and ordered to be entered of record. Ordered that the overseers of the poor be sworn to by the Court.

William Bolling H. Barnes guardian to Robert Williams and this day returned an account of said ward and was ordered to be the guardian and ordered to be entered of record.

And Invention of bargain and sale of the one part and James Leliston of the other part all error of and concerning the same, and do hereby relinquish all and every hereafter have of or in which was ordered to be recorded.

The last will and Testament of Samuel Turner and Cora Broomage recorded, and on the motion of Samuel Turner and together with Edward Reese and Samuel Broomage in the penalty of four thousand dollars granted the said Samuel Turner for obtaining probate thereof in due form.

Ordered that Thomas Jones, John Leliston, examine Kate adjust and settle the same. John Davis deceased and report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that John Kitchen and John Broomage examine Kate adjust and settle the same. John Broomage decd and report thereof to the Court.

Ordered that Master Commissioner of Henry Briggs administration as Sheriff, and report thereof to the Court.

John B. Gwallney is by the Court appointed P. Williamson and Evelina B. B. Williams. Whereupon the said Gwallney together with the said Williamson and Evelina B. B. Williams entered into and acknowledged a bond conditioned as the law directs.

Ordered that James Powell basant or any three of them being first sworn to be true and truly appraisers in current money all the personal Estate of James Powell deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

On the motion of Britton Spivey and Jesse Brooker his second executor in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned that the said Britton Spivey for obtaining probate thereof in due form.
