The Commissioners heretofore appointed by a former order of Court, this day made their report in the following words and figures following To wit: "Pursuant to the annexed decree, we the undersigned Commissioners have proceeded to divide the slaves, belonging to the estate of Robert Exum which were in the possession of Robert Exum, among the several distributees in the manner and form following. To wit, The slaves eleven, in number of several valuation making the sum of \$5050 whereof Rebecca Exum is entitled to her one third in value of the said estate is to have one third in value of the said estate allotted to her in free samples, which is \$1683.34 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; whereof we have allotted to her three negroes namely Sam valued at \$500 Lorenzo valued at \$500 and Lolly at \$500 making the sum of \$1500, which makes \$66.66 less than her one third part, which she is to pay that sum to John Exum his share deficient in value. The other remaining eight negroes besides those allotted to Rebecca Exum are valued to \$3366.66 $\frac{1}{2}$ , which we have divided into three equal parts makes to each part the sum of \$1122.22 $\frac{1}{2}$ . Whereupon we have allotted to John Exum the following slaves, Daniel valued, at \$625, and Jane at \$475 and \$1100 and he is to receive from Louisa Exum, the sum of \$222.22 $\frac{1}{2}$  which makes the sum of \$1122.22 $\frac{1}{2}$ . Which is his equal part. Rebecca Exum also allotted to Louisa Exum, the following, slaves, Henry valued at \$300 and Ary at \$300 making \$1150 which is \$27.78 $\frac{1}{2}$  over her part, which she is to pay as above stated to William Exum \$222.22 $\frac{1}{2}$  John Exum the sum of \$556 $\frac{1}{2}$ . We have also allotted to John Exum the following slaves namely Peter, valued at \$550, Ary at \$350 and Betty at \$350 making \$1050 and he is to receive from Rebecca Exum the sum of \$556 $\frac{1}{2}$  also to receive the sum of \$556 $\frac{1}{2}$  from Louisa Exum which makes the sum of \$1122.22 $\frac{1}{2}$ , which is his equal part. Given under our hands this 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1819, Patrick Ponds, Leathrop Ponds, James Lelayton, Willie Mellow by Consent of Parties It is decreed and ordered that the foregoing report be
