This day came the Plt. by his attorney and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of Sixty nine dollars and thirteen cents with legal interest thereon from the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January 1819, till paid, due by two bonds. It is therefore ordered by the Court that the plt. recover against the defendant the aforesaid sum of \$69.13 with interest as aforesaid till paid and he do hereby bind in this behalf expended. On it appearing further to the satisfaction of the Court that by the examination of John Baister who has been summoned as a witness in this case, that he has in his possession a note executed by John Stephenson to Samuel Pond the defendant in this case, bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1816 payable on or before the 20<sup>th</sup> of December next after the date thereof the principal and interest of which note amounts at this day to Twenty eight dollars and thirty three cents, which note was assigned by the said Pond to the said Baister, without his having any interest therein which he here acknowledges. It is therefore ordered that the said John Baister assign the said note to the said John Mangumhart as part payment of the due as aforesaid from the said Samuel Pond to John Mangumhart. And it appearing further to the satisfaction of the Court by the acknowledgement of the said John Baister, that he will be at the end of the year indebted to the said Samuel Pond in the sum of Twenty five dollars for the rent of the plantation of the said Samuel Pond and probably in a greater sum. It is therefore further ordered by the Court that the said John Baister do pay at the end of the year the further sum of Twenty five dollars to the said Mangumhart in further part payment of the debt aforesaid and judgment of this Court of the said Samuel Pond and it is further ordered that the said Baister at the end of the year pay to the said Mangumhart any balance which may in his hands be due the said Pond in discharge of the judgment and the Costs.
