This day came the parties by their counsel and the commissioners appointed by an interlocutory decree in this cause to make division of the land and slaves in the proceedings mentioned this day made a report in the following words to wit: "Pursuant to a decree of the County Court of Southampton a copy of which is hereto annexed, we the undersigned (with the assistance of the County Surveyor) have proceeded to divide the land in the said decree mentioned, which land we found to lie in two separate tracts, the one called the house tract containing 220 ³/₄ Acres, the other 'the Gallery tract' containing 200 ¹/₈ Acres, making in all 420 ¹/₈ Acres, into four lots, as nearly equal in value as the local situation of boundaries of each separate lot will appear on the plots which are herewith annexed as a part of this report.
