 to the State of Georgia and the other commissioners refusing to act, did on the
 19th day of February 1817 after giving due notice as required, sell at public
 auction for cash sixty two acres of land mentioned in the decree and
 Ann Putton became the purchaser thereof for the sum of one hundred and
 fifty dollars which sum was not sufficient to pay of the debt due to the
 said Ann Putton therefore there was no surplus to divide among the heirs
 of the said dec'd. Given under my hand this 19th day of July 1819. I Murfee"
 On consideration whereof it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner
 and form aforesaid made be confirmed.

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
