

Ordered that Benjamin Griffin, John Davis and Sept. Clark or any two of them do state, settle and adjust an account current of William Sperry's administration on the estate of Sarah Sperry deceased and make report thereof to Court.

Clement Rochelle a Justice of the Peace for this County this day returned a warrant issued by him upon application made to him by Thomas Muscum one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County for the apprehension of Edward Bryant who is charged on oath by Sally Schell of this County with being the father of her bastard child, and also returned a recognizance entered into by the said Edward Bryant when brought before the said Justice to appear here and abide and perform such order as the Court should make concerning the same, whereupon the said Edward Bryant appeared accordingly and the said Sally Schell being sworn & examined, and the said Edward Bryant being fully heard, this Court upon the whole circumstances of the case doth adjudge the said Edward Bryant to be the father of the said bastard child, and that the said child is likely to become chargeable to the County. Therefore it is ordered that the said Edward Bryant be charged with the annual payment of twenty dollars for the space of seven years from this day in case the said child shall live so long, and that the said Edward Bryant pay the same at the end of every year until the expiration of the said seven years, and thereupon the said Edward Bryant is committed to Jail until he shall enter into a recognizance with two securities, himself in the sum of one hundred and forty dollars and his said securities in the sum of twenty dollars conditioned that the said Bryant shall perform the above judgment of the Court -

Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor or either of them do bring out Alexander and Henry Manny from children according to Law.

Ordered that the Justices be summoned to the next Court to take into consideration the case of Dempsey Bryant and others who have been unlawfully and with intent to obtain permission to remain in this State according to Law -

Ordered that the account of Jonathan Suter Constable amounting to \$7.36. The account of Jonathan Suter Constable amounting to \$2.73 cents be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination and payment.

Ordered that Seth Nicholas, Thomas Fitzhugh and Henry Applewhite or any two of them do visit the conveniences and inconveniences of turning the road as they may think proper near Applewhite meeting house and report to the Court the comparative conveniences and inconveniences as well as the public as to individuals that will result in turning the said Road, whereupon the said Commissioners made the following report to wit: "Agreeable to an order of Southampton County Court bearing date September Court 1819 Seth Nicholas, Thomas Fitzhugh, and Henry Applewhite have been appointed Commissioners to visit the Road leading by Applewhite Meeting house, and are authorized if no inconvenience shall attend the turning of the same, to turn it as shall be thought most convenient by the said Commissioners, during the continuance of a Court meeting, that is to commence at said meeting house on the 7th of Oct. 1819.
