

At a Court of quarter Sessions held for the County of Southampton the 18th day of November 1819

Ordered that James Harris, James Myrick, Arthur Williamson & Settleton Williamson or any two of them do State and settle an account Current of the administration of the Estates of George Lloyd and Walter Neutlings and make report thereof to Court.

Samuel B. Jones, Henry Lee, John Urquhart, jr. William Briggs and William Ricks, who have been appointed Justices of the Peace for this County by a Commission, from the Governor, with the seal of the Commonwealth thereto affixed this day appeared in Court and took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the several oaths of office, the oath prescribed by the Act entitled "An act to suppress duelling" and the oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

George Jones this day presented to the Court a Commission under the hand of the Governor with the seal of the Commonwealth thereto affixed, whereby he is commissioned to execute the Office of Sheriff of this County for the ensuing twelve months. Whereupon the said George Jones took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath prescribed by the Act entitled "An act to suppress duelling" the oath to support the Constitution of the United States and the oath of Office.

Edwards Bulls and Lewis C. Ingham are by George Jones Sheriff of this County appointed his deputies during pleasure, and the Court being of opinion that the said Bulls & Ingham are men of honest probity and good demeanor, they severally took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath prescribed by an Act entitled "An act to suppress duelling" the oath to support the Constitution of the United States and the oath of Office.

Settleton Mason forsworn, William Newton, James Newsum, Nathaniel Birds, Joseph Bull, Abner Kindness, Miller Francis, James Powell, Thomas Moore, Edward Lundy, Norwidge Ellis, Benjamin Merrill, Benjamin Branch, Arthur Hart, Joel Counsel, Henry Wornell, John Bisler, George Williams, Shadrack Cloughart Taylor Edwards, John Laver, & Matthew Moulford were sworn a Grand Jury of Inquest for the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and found an Indictment against Jeremy Boyant a true bill, An Indictment against Patrick Pava and others a true bill, An Indictment against Thomas R. Gray a true bill, An Indictment against George Williams and others a true bill, and having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that process issue against the several persons thus summoned by the Grand Jury returnable to the next quarterly Court.
