Coley, Peter Sumner, and Herod Sumner or any three of them do divide the tract of land lying in this County whereof William Stephenson did seize & possess into five equal parts having regard to value by proper metes and bounds, and allot one equal part to each of the complainants and the remaining part to the defendant. It is further decreed and ordered that the before named persons or any three do after giving three weeks public notice of the time and place of sale sell at public auction a negro man slave whereof William Stephenson did possess on a credit of twelve months. That they divide the proceeds of the sale into five equal parts, securing the payment of the same by separate bonds with good security and that they deliver over to the complainant William Stephenson one bond and to the Guardian of each of the infant complainants and defendant one other bond. And it is further ordered that they or such of them as may act do make a report to this Court of their proceedings herein in order to a final decree—

Blount and Elizabeth his wife in right of his wife one feather bed two cows and pigs, two cows and calves and one horse first ascertaining the value of each separate article and annexing the same thereto, and that they or such of them as may act do make a report to this Court in order to a final decree—
