Henry Jones who stands bound by a recognizance entered into before a Justice of the Peace for this County, for his appearance here this day to answer the complaint of Mary Jones against him for a breach of the peace, appearing accordingly, and the parties being fully heard it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Henry give security for his keeping the peace for the term of twelve months, that is to say the said Henry in the sum of one hundred dollars with two securities in the sum of fifty dollars each. And thereupon the said Henry Jones with Benjamin Whitfield and George Whitfield his securities, here in Court, severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted to Thomas M. Randolph Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth, the said Henry Jones in the sum of one hundred dollars and the said Benjamin Whitfield & George Whitfield in the sum of fifty dollars each of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth underdred. Yet upon this condition, that if the said Henry Jones shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth, and especially towards the said Mary Jones, for the term of twelve months as aforesaid then this recognizance to be void.
