This cause was this day debated by consent of parties and agent of the Court and was heard on the bill and answer and arguments of counsel, upon consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that Sewall Harris, Thomas Reilly, Spradley Williams and Drury Waller or any two of them do with the assistance of the County Surveyor of mays, set apart by proper miles and bounds one eighth having regard to value of the tract of land lying in this County whereof John M. C. Day a minor lately died seised, supposed to contain one hundred and fifty six acres and all the same to Richard B Day the defendant a brother of the half blood of the said John M. C. Day and that they divide the balance of said tract of land in like manner equally between the complainants Edmund Day and Nathaniel Rochelle and his wife Francis late Francis Day and the defendants John Arthur Turner an infant son of Edwin Turner and his late wife Martha formerly Martha Day. And it is further decreed and ordered that the before mentioned persons or any two of them, do after giving reasonable public notice of the time and place of sale, expose to public sale on a credit of months the slaves mentioned in the bill to wit, Jack, Abel, Darius and Mary. That they take a bond or bonds from the purchasers or purchasers for one eighth of the amount of sales with good security and assign the same to the defendant Richard B Day. That they divide the balance of the proceeds of the sale into three equal parts and take a bond or bonds with approved security for the payment of each and assign the bond or bonds for 1/3 to the complainant Edmund Day, for 1/3 to Nathaniel Rochelle in right of his wife Francis, and for the remaining 1/3 to the guardian of the infant defendant John Arthur Turner, and finally it is ordered that the aforesaid persons or such of them as may act do make a report of their proceedings herein in order to a final decree -

This cause came on this day to be heard upon the bill and answer by consent of parties and with the agent of the Court, whereupon the Court doth order, adjudge & decree that Frederick Cobb, Jesse Parker, and James Murfee or any two of them, assisted by a Surveyor of mays, do allot and set apart to the defendant Milley Cobb, one third part of the tract of land of which Kinchen Cobb. died seised, containing by estimation two hundred and sixty or two hundred and seventy acres and adjoining the lands of John Cooper, Henry Vaughan and others for and during her natural life, and the remaining two thirds thereof the complainants or such of them as may act, are directed to divide into three equal parts and allot one of the said parts to each of the infants complainants and the remaining to the complainant White in right of his wife Tempy, and the Court further adjudge and decree that the complainants or such of them as may act, do assign and allot to the defendant Milley Cobb for and during her natural life one third part of the following slaves to wit, Sirin, Ned, Henry, and Leazar, and that afterwards they or such of them as may act do assign and allot to the defendant Milley Cobb for and during her natural life, do divide the remaining two thirds parts of the said slaves into three equal shares, and deliver to each of the infant children one of the said shares, and to the complainant Brettan White, also one of the said shares - and the Court believing that there will be a difficulty in making division of the said slaves in kind, doth
